




President's Message

I am so honored to serve as 2023 President during my ninth year as an OBF Trustee. Service on this board has shown me the depth of legal needs that exist in our state among individuals, the philanthropic community and, most surprisingly, segments of our state justice system. As an attorney, I am motivated by problem solving and helping others. The OBF provides numerous opportunities to do both.

The OBF's vision is to enrich lives, eliminate obstacles, and ensure justice. In our day-to-day work, we support a variety of law-related programs and projects. First, we fund nonprofit legal programs assisting children in need, domestic violence victims, the homeless, refugees of war and victims of human trafficking. Second, we fund grants for technology so our county courts can expand their capacities and improve courtroom experiences for local bar members. Third, the OBF provides scholarships to Oklahoma law students and stipends to incentivize court reporters to consider careers in rural Oklahoma courts experiencing staffing difficulties. These are a few examples of how we carry out our vision and help people overcome legal barriers, so they can live better lives.

The legal needs in our state are vast, and it will take every Oklahoma lawyer to make an impact. Partnering with the OBF is one of the best ways to do that and to ensure there is adequate funding to support our communities.


